What people can look forward to for us from the events that we're planning at the Alumni Association will be the 50th reunion. The class of 1972 is coming back in force and we actually have a pretty significant panel discussion where we'll have the Mayor of Springfield, Ken McClure, will be a part of that discussion, as is Tina Stillwell, who's been a long time employee, retired employee from Missouri State.
